WHEREAS, COMPANIES THAT EMPLOY A MORE DIVERSE WORKFORCE SEE GREATER INCREASES IN PRODUCTIVITY, PROFITABILITY AND LOWER STAFF TURNOVER; AND

WHEREAS, WOMEN MAKE SIGNIFICANT CONTRIBUTIONS TO OUR COMMUNITIES AND SHOULD RECEIVE EQUAL OPPORTUNITIES; AND

WHEREAS, ECONOMIC EQUALITY FOR ALL REQUIRES EQUITABLE ACCESS TO QUALITY JOB OPPORTUNITIES AS WELL AS PROTECTION FROM DISCRIMINATION; AND

WHEREAS, APPRENTICESHIPS OFFER A GATEWAY TO ECONOMIC STABILITY, DELIVERING OPPORTUNITIES FOR APPRENTICES TO EARN AND LEARN THROUGH STRUCTURED ON-THE-JOB TRAINING AND TO RECEIVE CREDENTIALS FOR ACHIEVING COMPETENCY; AND

WHEREAS, ORGANIZED LABOR HAS HAD A LONGSTANDING EFFORT AND COMMITMENT TO DEVELOPING HIGH-QUALITY APPRENTICESHIP PROGRAMS AND HIGHLY SKILLED WORKERS, ESPECIALLY IN THE CONSTRUCTION TRADES; NOW THEREFORE BE IT
