It's Time! is the theme for the 2018 Sisters in the Brotherhood Conference. This theme is appropriate given some recent and exciting news about UBC female members. First and foremost, HUGE congratulations to Evelyn Shapiro on becoming the first woman EST in the United States. Evelyn chaired the 2015 Sisters Conference and is doing the same for 2018. She will now take her leadership talents to a new position in the Pacific Northwest Regional Council.

Congratulations also to the growing number of women who are occupying other leadership roles in their Councils. This newsletter contains examples of women serving as delegates, recording secretary, and treasurer. One Sister making history is Colette McCready – she is the first female delegate from Dock-builders and Timbermen, Local 1556.

Regional Updates:

Industrial Council

The **Industrial Council** welcomes two new SIB Committees. Jeannie Weakley is chair in Roseburg, Oregon and Tammy McCormick is chair in Columbus, Tennessee. Both are working with their members to implement activities that will help the community and workers, as well as increase Union membership.

Throughout the Council, other committees have been working hard to enroll members in the Texting Program. This will be an important way for members to stay connected and current on Council initiatives.



Canadian District

In the **Atlantic Canada Regional Council**, the **Cape Breton SIB Committee** had one Sister, Trish MacQuarrie, complete her Carpentry Diploma through a local college. This is a two-year program that gave Trish skills she needs to advance through her apprenticeship.

The **Nova Scotia & Prince Edward Island SIB Committee** has been focusing on recruitment, retention, education, politics, and public engagement.

For example:

- Sisters are still working with colleges and high schools on recruitment. They hope to do some career-day events this Fall.
- A new Sister has joined Local 83.
- Three out-of-work Sisters, who regularly attend meetings, learned about work opportunities and got jobs. This occurred because the committee constantly stays in touch with all Sisters, encouraging them to participate in meetings.
- Sisters attended training at the ITC, as well as at the Carpenters and Millwright Colleges.
- Sisters are running for Delegate seats.
- Local 1386 will host annual picnic for members and the public.

- Nova Scotia Sisters are joining forces with the Mainland Building Trades Nova Scotia Chapter of “Build Together.” Nova Scotia has 13 affiliated trades in their Mainland Building Trades, and Sisters believe that this collaboration will help them reach more women, as well as provide an enhanced opportunity to support and mentor each other.

In the **British Columbia Regional Council SIB Committee**, Sisters attended the opening celebration of the new British Columbia Center for Women in the Trades. Upcoming recruitment and educational activities include:

Outstanding New York City District Council!

The **New England Regional Council** has increased the number of Sisters in leadership positions. Over the past several months, 22 women have been appointed to positions as delegates, alternate delegates, treasurer, and recording secretary. The Council has also expanded its marketing campaign to include women on their huge electronic billboard outside the Boston Office.

Two examples include:

- Posting details about the monthly Tradeswomen Tuesdays meetings on the electronic billboard. Interest has been high, with 30-50 women attending the Open Houses. [Click here](#) to see the awesome billboard.

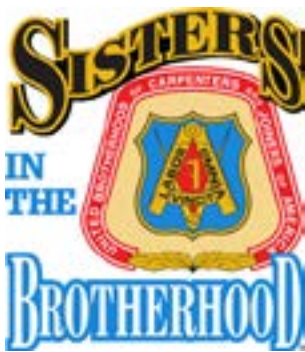
Sisters in New York have also been working hard to connect with the community and recruit women Carpenters.

The **Boston SIB Committee** has been significantly involved in spearheading and expanding the marketing campaign to recruit women.

Consider these initiatives:

- Participated in an event attended by contractors, Union members, and hopefuls looking for employment. The purpose was to teach attendees about new hiring goals and connect unemployed Boston residents with contractors. Sisters were there to encourage women to join the Carpenters Union. - Liz Skidmore, SIB chair, joined the stage with some of New England’s biggest developers at BisNow’s yearly event on June 12, 2018. In addressing the 300 plus attendees, Liz talked about the NERCC efforts to increase diversity. She was joined at the event by 12 staff members who interacted with developers. Sisters in the **Central & Western Massachusetts SIB Committee** continued their efforts to recruit and retain women. They also rallied to Union causes.

For instance:

- Tyeka Robinson and Lisa Clauson talked Union benefits and wages on a New England Public Radio show. Tyeka described her experiences as a Carpenter and Lisa explained what the NERCC is doing to attract more women. The discussion was positive and informative. - Sisters participated in their third annual Eastern Massachusetts GIT (Girls in Trades) Conference and Career Fair. With over 500 female students attending from 27 vocational schools, the event was a huge success. Sisters hosted apprenticeship booths and led workshops, putting the Carpenters front and center. - Sisters joined Brothers, in Springfield, Massachusetts to support a University report that proposed a hiring requirement for women. The report also set minimum guidelines for Springfield residents, minorities, women, and veterans. Springfield resident Tyeka Robinson, as well as other NERCC members, testified to encourage improvement and enforcement of the City’s Responsible Employers Ordinance (REO).
