FEDERAL LAW GIVES YOU THE RIGHT TO:

- Form, join, or assist a union;
- Choose a representative to bargain with your employer on your behalf;
- Act together with other employees for your benefit and protection;
- Choose not to engage in any of these protected activities.

WE WILL NOT and do not give effect to Section 45-Q of our Constitution in a manner that would require a member to pay a fine or assessment before paying dues pursuant to a valid union security clause requiring payment of dues to keep one's job.

WE WILL NOT in any like or related manner restrain or coerce you in the exercise of your rights under Section 7 of the Act.

WE WILL, in a Secretary's Update and by email to all Councils notify all Councils nationwide how to interpret Section 45-Q of the UBC Constitution; specifically, **WE WILL** tell all Councils that nothing in Section 45-Q requires that a member pay a fine before payment of dues may be accepted pursuant to a valid union security clause requiring payment of dues to keep one's job, and that Section 45-Q may not be interpreted in that manner.
